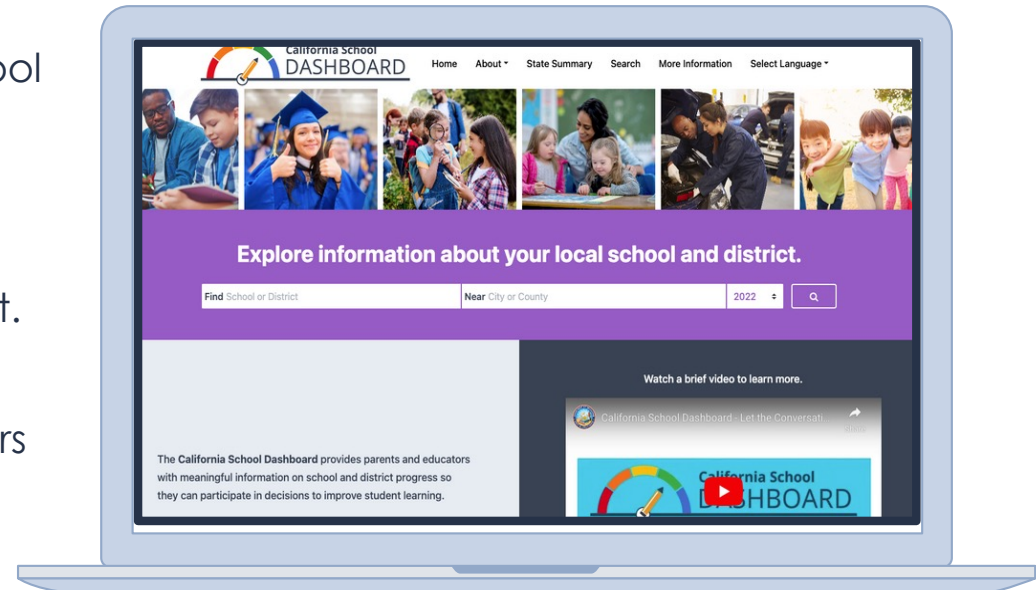

# What is the Dashboard ?

The California School Dashboard is an online tool that displays the performance of local educational agencies (LEAs), schools, and student groups on a set of state and local measures to assist in identifying strengths, challenges, and areas in need of improvement.

The Dashboard provides parents and educators with meaningful information on school and district progress so they can participate in decisions to improve student learning.



# What is the Dashboard also used for ?



## Eligibility for Support

- ❖ Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) Differentiated Assistance
  - Districts, County Offices of Education, and Charter Schools
- ❖ Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA)
  - Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI)
  - Additional Targeted Support and Improvement (ATSI)
    - Schools

# What's different this year?

The 2022 Dashboard reported status only due to the lack of multiple-year data (result of COVID-19). **Status bars were all purple** and ranged from very low to very high. Purple status bars will appear on the 2023 Dashboard for College/Career Indicator (CCI) only.



**COLOR is back on the 2023 Dashboard!** Performance colors are determined based on a combination of status (current year performance) and change (current year performance compared with prior year performance). There are five performance levels:





# Five-by-Five Tables



The accountability system combines five Status and five Change levels creating a five-by-five placement grid which is used to identify the performance color for the Dashboard.

Performance Levels (or colors) for each state indicator are determined using current year performance (or Status) and the difference from prior year (or Change) to show growth or decline.

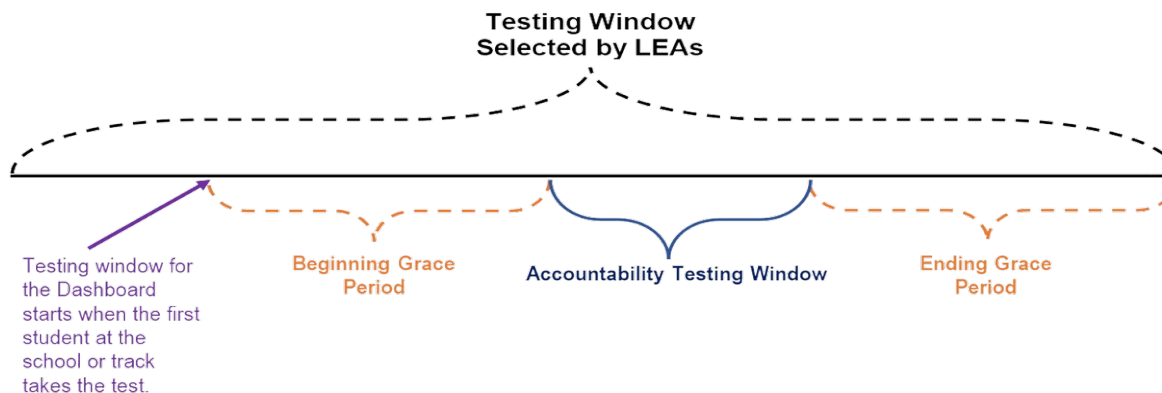

## Differences between CAASPP and Dashboard

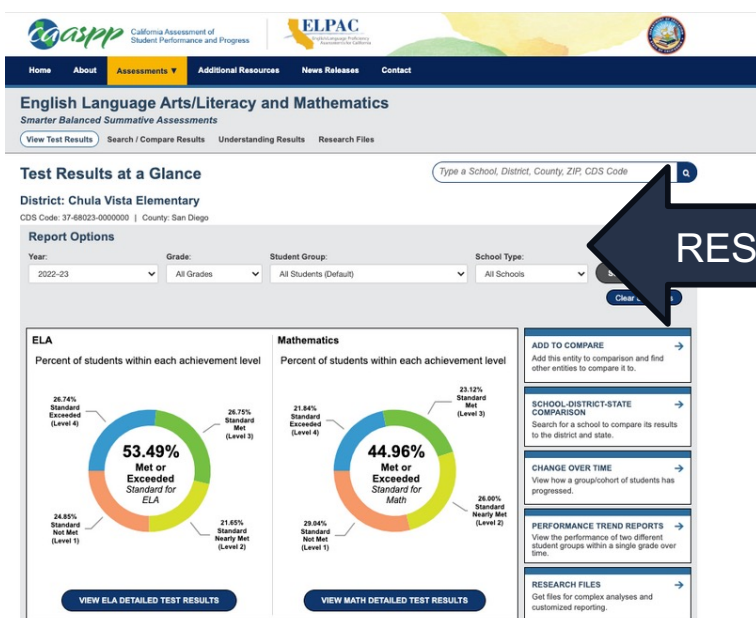

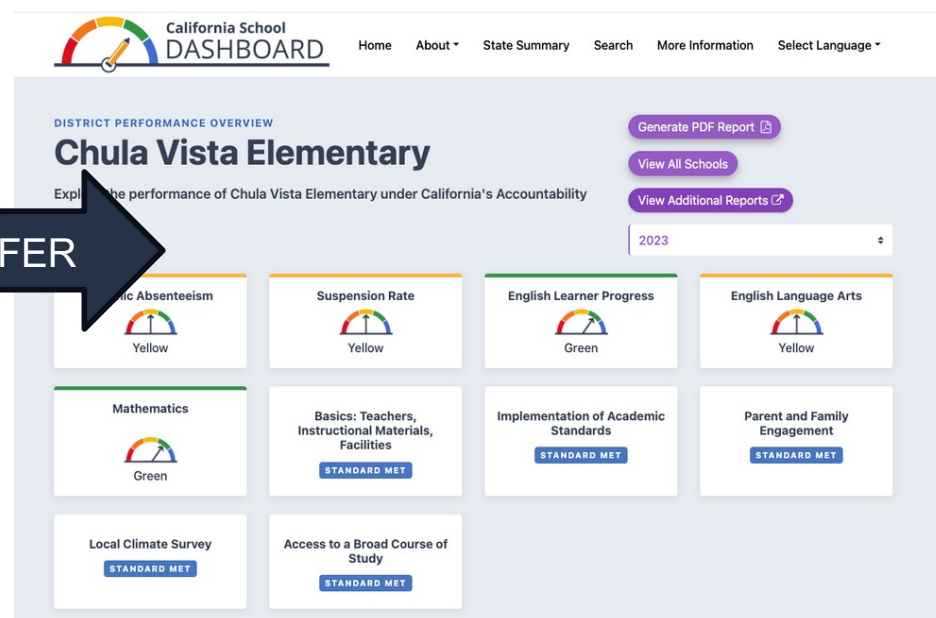

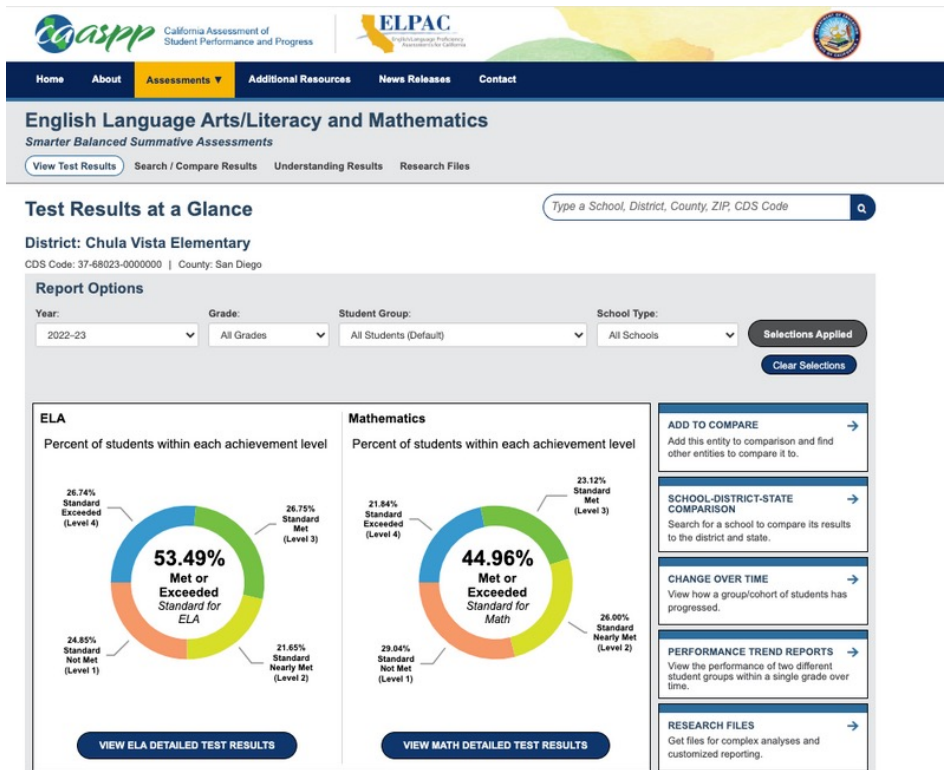

# Test Results for California Assessments



## Reports Percentage of Students in Each Achievement Level

- The Test Results for California's Assessments website reports the number and percent of students in each achievement level. These results are based on all students who took the test regardless of the number of days enrolled.

# California School Dashboard & DFS

## Reports Average Distance from Standard

- The Dashboard reports the Distance from Standard (DFS), which measures the average distance from the Standard Met Achievement Level (i.e., Level 3) for all students who are continuously enrolled.
- Distance from Standard (DFS) is also referred to as Distance from 3 (DF3)

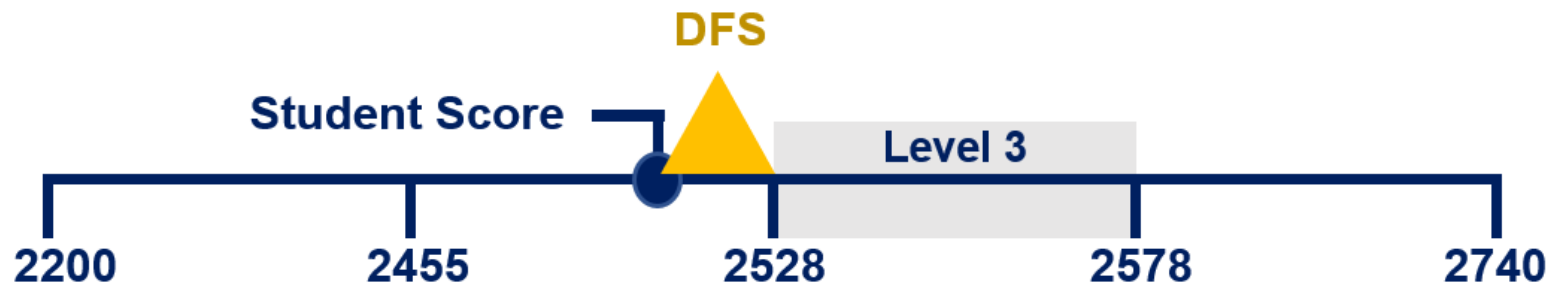
## 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Example: Scale Scores

- In grade five, the scale scores for ELA range from 2200 to 2730. The scale scores for Mathematics range from 2220 to 2740. Within each range, there are four distinct achievement levels

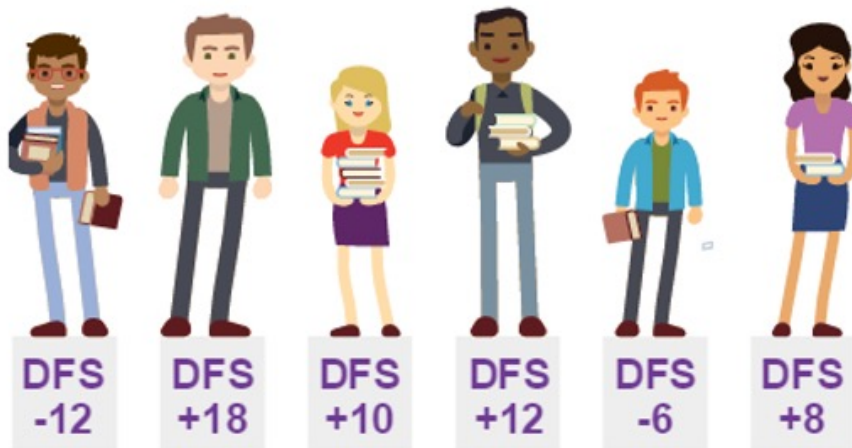
## Distance from Standard (DFS)

- The DFS represents the “distance” between a student’s score on the Smarter Balanced Summative Assessments and the Standard Met Achievement Level (i.e., the lowest possible scale score for Level 3).

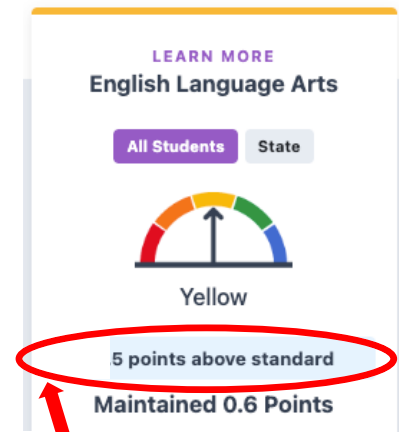


# Average Distance from Standard

The DFS for each student in the denominator is calculated separately and then all the students' "distances" are summed and divided by the total number of continuously enrolled students to determine an average DFS for each LEA, school, and student group.



$$\frac{-12 + 18 + 10 + 12 - 6 + 8}{6} = 5 \text{ points}$$

# Report on the Governor's Proposed 2024-25 Budget

# Governor's Proposed K-12 2024-25 Education Budget

- Economic Outlook
  - Governor announced State is facing a \$37.9 billion deficit in 2024-25.
  - Proposals for closing the State budget deficit:
    - State reserve draw-down (Rainy Day Fund), funding delays, reductions, funding shifts, revenue generation, and borrowing.
  - State Budget reflects \$18.4 billion in budget reserves
    - Maintains a \$5.7 billion Public School System Stabilization Account (PSSSA) reserve at the end of 2024-25, down from \$10.8.



# Governor's Proposed K-12 2024-25 Education Budget

- Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF)
  - Cost-of-Living-Adjustment (COLA)
  - 2024-25 0.76%, previously projected at 3.94%
  - 2025-26 2.73%, previously projected at 3.29%
- Special Education Ongoing Funding
  - 0.76% COLA
- 10% District Reserve Cap in 2024-25
  - The 2024-25 balance of \$5.7 billion in the Public School System Stabilization Account (PSSSA) continues to trigger the district 10% reserve cap in 2024-25.



# Governor's Proposed K-12 2024-25 Education Budget

- Facilities
  - Delay of \$550 million for the CA Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten, and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program until 2025-26
- Retirement Systems
  - No additional funding for California State Teachers Retirement System (CalSTRS) or California Public Employees Retirement System (CalPERS) for employer rate relief
  - CalPERS rates are projected increase in 2024-25 from 26.68% to 27.80%
  - CalSTRS rates are projected to remain flat in 2024-25 at 19.10%



# Next Steps and Timeline

February

- Budget trailer bills released providing critical details to the January proposal

Spring/May

- Budget Subcommittee examines specific details of proposal.
- Most decisions delayed until MAY REVISE

June

- End June – State Budget Adopted
