MINUTES

1. CALL TO ORDER/INTRODUCTION

DELAC Chairperson, Paola Granados, called the meeting to order at 12:03 p.m.

2. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Superintendent, Dr. Francisco Escobedo shared that parents will be receiving his newsletter, which will include a link to his latest Superintendent's Chat and FAQs, and to expect an important survey on hybrid learning. Dr. Escobedo reminded the District will not open to hybrid learning until San Diego County returns to the red tier. In the meantime, the District has begun preparations to make ready its schools, announcing the District has received HEPA filters and are being distributed to all District schools for classrooms and offices.

3. DISTRICT ADMINISTRATORS' REPORT

Mr. Oscar Esquivel, Deputy Superintendent, provided a brief fiscal update on the District informing the Board of Education (Board) approved the District's budget with a positive certification at its December 15, 2020 meeting. Mr. Esquivel added on December 30 the federal stimulus was approved, and on January 8, 2021, the Governor released the 2021-2022 state budget with a positive budget for schools with on-going and one-time monies to help schools return to in-person instruction. Additional information regarding the Governor's budget will be shared at the January 20 Board meeting and at the January 27 Budget Advisory Committee virtual meeting, which begins at 6 p.m.

Dr. Matthew Tessier, Assistant Superintendent, Innovation and Instruction, reminded the District's Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) was replaced in 2020-21 as the Learning Continuity and Attendance Plan (LCP) due to circumstances affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. The LCP, which is a one-year plan, focused on pandemic-related instruction and materials. The District will begin planning on a new 3-year LCAP, which monies received supports children who have the most unmet needs (English as a second language, low-income, homeless, foster youth, at or below poverty line). Dr. Tessier welcomes feedback and input on how to maximize dollars to support our children. Feedback can also be submitted to the District's Parent Engagement Liaison, Angelica Maldonado.

4. CHAIRPERSONS' REPORT

Ms. Granados performed introductions of newly elected members to the Executive Board, DAC Vice-Chairperson, Matthew Baker (Tiffany), DAC Board Member, Tiffany Gonzalez (Sunnyside), DELAC Vice-Chairperson, Anita Wende (Veterans), DELAC Board Member, Dr. Pedro Carrillo (Sunnyside).

Ms. Granados shared the results of the Needs Assessment informing that the Executive Board is working to provide parent training sessions addressing each of the topics before the end of the 2020-21 school year.

9. RECLASSIFICATION

Ms. Patricia Pimentel, Language Development and Instruction Coordinator, reviewed the District's reclassification procedures and goals for English Learners. Ms. Pimentel went over the significance of reclassification, what happens after reclassification, and the District's reclassification criteria. Reclassification of students with disabilities was reviewed by Ms. Maria Garcia, Director of Pupil Services, adding that reclassification is the collaborative work of the IEP team and the individual needs of the student. Ms. Garcia mentioned that parent input is critical within this process.

10. ELPAC

Ms. Nancy Rojas, Language Development and Instruction Coordinator, provided an overview of the Summative ELPAC. Ms. Rojas discussed the Initial and the Summative assessments which test the same areas: listening, speaking, reading, and writing, and how to add these areas into everyday activities and conversations. Ms. Rojas informed of the Summative ELPAC testing window, which is between February 16 and May 7, 2021, depending on grade level. 11. INTERNET SAFETY FOR PARENTS

Ms. Marissa Bejarano, Deputy District Attorney and Community Partnership Prosecutor South Bay Region, provided an overview of the parent training virtual workshop, Internet Safety for Parents. The virtual event, hosted by the San Diego County District Attorney's Office, is scheduled for January 12 at 6 p.m. and will address and educate parents in the three areas: inappropriate conduct online, inappropriate contact, and inappropriate content.

12. DISTRICT COMMUNICATIONS

Angelica Maldonado shared a monthly District and Community Resource Calendar with valuable information benefitting parents and the school community.
